Sir/Madam,

With reference to above, it is to inform that the application for the renewal of recognition of the Deer Park, Neelon, Punjab as received by this office vide reference no. 2 above.

Shri D.N.S Suman, IFS (Retd.) was deputed by this office to carry out the evaluation of the Deer Park, Neelon, Punjab vide CZA letter at reference no. 1 above. The Zoo was accordingly evaluated on June 22, 2022.

The evaluation report (copy enclosed) as submitted by the evaluation officer was deliberated in the 106th meeting of the Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority held on September 27th, 2022. The Technical Committee after detailed deliberations recommended to the Central Zoo Authority for the for the renewal of recognition of the Deer Park, Neelon, Punjab for a period of two years and, subject to compliance with observation/ recommendation in the table below and mid-term evaluation. The members also recommended that the Zoo Operator may be directed to submit half-yearly compliance report with respect to observation/ recommendation stipulated while recognition.

Subsequently, the recommendation of 106th Technical Committee Meeting was approved by the Chairperson, Central Zoo Authority and the same was ratified by the Central Zoo Authority in its 40th meeting held on 28.11.2023. Accordingly, the Central Zoo Authority has granted the renewal of recognition of the Deer Park, Neelon, Punjab for a period up to 29.11.2024 under Section 38-H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972. This is subject to the ratification of this decision in the next meeting of the Central Zoo Authority.

The renewal of recognition of the Deer Park, Neelon, Punjab shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority, at any point of time, if the zoo operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.

Sir,

With reference to above, the undersigned is directed to inform that recognition of the Deer Park, Neelon, Punjab under Section 38-H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, was valid till September 27, 2019. Application received from the Divisional Forest Officer, Phillaur Wildlife Division for renewal of recognition. Shri Shailesh Prasad, IFS (Retired), evaluating officer deputed by this office has evaluated the zoo on February 28, 2020. Copy of the Evaluation Report is enclosed herewith for your perusal and needful action.

2. Evaluation Report of the Deer Park, Neelon, Punjab was placed before the Technical Committee in its 96th Meeting held on July 30, 2020. The Technical Committee, after detailed deliberation, made its recommendation to the Central Zoo Authority.

3. This office issued Office Memorandum F.No.7-10/2020-CZA(PART-I) dated August 25, 2020 regarding renewal of recognition of the zoo. Subsequently, the Central Zoo Authority, in its 37th Meeting held on December 7, 2020, in exercise of powers conferred under sub-section (1), (3) and (4) of Section 38-H under the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, approved recommendation of the Technical Committee.

4. The Central Zoo Authority has regularised the period after September 27, 2019 and renewed recognition of the Deer Park, Neelon, Punjab as a Mini Zoo for a period up to **August 19, 2021** subject to compliance with following conditions as per the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 (RZR) and mid-term evaluation of the zoo.



Sir,

The recognition to the Deer Park, Neelon, Punjab under Section 38-H of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 was valid upto 05.05.2017 subject to compliance with conditions specified under the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 and mid-term evaluation of the zoo. The Divisional Forest Officer, Wildlife Division, Phillaur, Punjab has applied vide letter No. 2616 dated 02.03.2017 for renewal of recognition to the Deer Park, Neelon, Punjab for the period beyond 05.05.2017 as per provisions of Section 38-H of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 under Rule 8 of the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009.

The zoo was evaluated on 16.10.2017 and the evaluation report was placed before the 85th Meeting of the Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority (CZA) held on 23rd March, 2018. The Committee noted that the Operator of the Deer Park, Neelon, Punjab violated the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 and, therefore, the Technical Committee of CZA, authorised the Member Secretary, CZA to take cognizance under Section 55 (aa) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 for reported violation of provisions laid down under Section 38-H(3) & (4) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972. Further, the Technical Committee of the CZA decided to serve Show-Cause Notice and grant an opportunity of personal hearing to the zoo operator or his representative under Section 38-H(6) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 as to why the recognition of the zoo be not cancelled.

The Technical Committee of the CZA in its 85th Meeting held on 23.03.2018, on perusal of the Evaluation Report, observed that the management of the zoo violated various provisions under the Recognition of Zoo Rules (RZR), 2009. As decided by the Technical Committee, the office of the CZA issued Notice dated 03.05.2018 and provided an opportunity of hearing to the Operator of the Zoo under Section 38-H(6) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972. The hearing was conducted on 24.05.2018 in the office of the Central Zoo Authority in the presence of Shri Khushwinder Singh, Divisional Forest Officer, Wildlife Division, Phillaur, Punjab under the Chairmanship of the Member Secretary, Central Zoo Authority. The Proceeding of hearing dated 24.05.2018 is enclosed with this letter for your perusal and needful action at your end.

The reply furnished by the zoo operator to CZA's Notice dated 03.05.2018 was considered by the Technical Committee in its 86th Meeting held on 28.09.2018. After detailed deliberations, the Technical Committee decided for renewal of recognition of the Deer Park, Neelon, Punjab for a period of one year from 28.09.2018. A copy of the evaluation report as submitted by the evaluating officer is enclosed with this letter for your perusal and needful action.

The renewal of recognition to the Deer Park, Neelon, Punjab as a "Mini Category Zoo" as per the provisions of Section 38H(1) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 is for a period up to 27.09.2019 subject to the compliance of the following directives under the Recognition of Zoo Rules (RZR), 2009 and mid-term evaluation, and to regularise the period after 05.05.2017:-

Reference is invited to above cited correspondence. It is to inform that the evaluation of the Deer Park, Neelon, Ludhiana, Punjab was carried out by Dr. Brij Kishor Gupta and Mr. T. Ajay Kumar on 27.03.2016. The evaluation report of the Deer Park, Neelon as submitted by the evaluating officer was considered by the Technical Committee in its 78th Meeting held on 6th May, 2016.

The Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority has decided to issue Show Cause Notice under Section 38H (5&6) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 to Deer Park, Neelon for non-compliance with conditions stipulated by the Central Zoo Authority in violation of Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 (amended in 2013), to provide time period of six months to the zoo to submit a compliance report on the issues mentioned in the Show Cause Notice. Besides, the Committee has decided to grant conditional renewal for recognition for a period of one year. Show Cause Notice is being sent separately.

The renewal of recognition of Deer Park, Neelon as "a Mini Category Zoo" as per the provisions of Section 38H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 is for a period up to 5th May, 2017 subject to the compliance of the following directives under Rule 10 of Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 (Amended in 2013) and mid-term evaluation of the zoo:-
