Sir,

With reference to above, the undersigned is directed to inform that recognition of the G.B. Pant High Altitude Zoo, Nainital, Uttarakhand under Section 38-H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, was valid till July 28, 2024. Application for renewal of recognition was received in this office on April 18, 2025 from the Zoo Director. Dr. Natasha S. Vashisth, Technical Assistant in Office of CZA deputed by this office has evaluated the zoo on December 26, 2024. Copy of the Evaluation Report is enclosed herewith for your perusal and needful action.

2. Evaluation Report of the G.B. Pant High Altitude Zoo, Nainital, was placed before the Technical Committee in its 113th Meeting held on April 16, 2025. The Technical Committee, after detailed deliberation, made its recommendation to the Central Zoo Authority. Subsequently, the Central Zoo Authority in its 42nd Meeting held on April 22, 2025 has approved recommendation of the Technical Committee.

3. As per provisions of sub-section (1), (3) and (4) of Section 38-H under the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, regularised the period after July 28, 2024 and renewed recognition of the G.B. Pant High Altitude Zoo, Nainital, as a Small Zoo for a period up to **May 13, 2028** subject to compliance with following conditions as per the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 (RZR) and mid-term evaluation of the zoo.

6. The renewal of recognition of the G.B. Pant High Altitude Zoo, Nainital, for period beyond May 13, 2028 would be considered on the basis of compliance of the conditions stated above and general performance of the zoo.

7. The recognition of the G.B. Pant High Altitude Zoo, Nainital, shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority at any point of time if the Zoo Operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.

Sir,

With reference to above, I am directed to inform that the recognition of G.B. Pant High Altitude Zoo, Nainital, Uttarakhand was accorded up to August 19th, 2021 vide reference no. 3 above. The application for the renewal of recognition of G.B. Pant High Altitude Zoo, Nainital, Uttarakhand for the period beyond August 19th, 2021 was received by this office vide reference no. 2 above.

Shri U Prakasham, IFS(Retd.), Former PCCF(HoFF), Madhya Pradesh was deputed by this office to carry out the evaluation of the G.B. Pant High Altitude Zoo, Nainital, Uttarakhand vide CZA letter at reference no. 1 above. The Zoo was accordingly evaluated on April 13th & 14th, 2022 by Shri U Prakasham, IFS (Retd.).

The evaluation report (copy enclosed) as submitted by the evaluation officer was deliberated in the 105th meeting of the Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority held on May 11th, 2022. The Technical Committee after detailed deliberations recommended to the Central Zoo Authority for the renewal of recognition of G.B Pant High Altitude Zoo,

Nainital, Uttarakhand for a period of two years and to regularise the period after August 19th, 2021, subject to compliance with observation/ recommendation in the table below and mid-term evaluation. The members also recommended that the Zoo Operator may be directed to submit half-yearly compliance report with respect to observation/ recommendation stipulated while renewal of recognition.

Subsequently, the recommendation of 105th Technical Committee Meeting was approved by the Chairperson, Central Zoo Authority. Accordingly, the Central Zoo Authority has regularised the period after August 19th, 2021 and renewed the recognition of G.B Pant High Altitude Zoo, Nainital, Uttarakhand for a period up to July 28, 2024 under Section 38-H(1), (3) & (4) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972. This is subject to the ratification of this decision in the next meeting of the Central Zoo Authority.

The recognition to the Pt. G. B. Pant High Altitude Zoo, Nainital shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority, at any point of time if the Zoo Operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.
