Sir/Madam,

With reference to above, the recognition of the Deer Park-Kesoram Cement, Basant Nagar, Peddapalli District, Telangana, under Section 38-H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, was valid till January 20, 2018. Application for renewal of recognition was received in this office on March 29, 2023 from the Officer-in-charge. Shri Muvvala Kondala Rao, IFS (Retd.) was deputed to evaluate the zoo on November 6-7, 2025. Copy of the Evaluation Report is enclosed herewith for your perusal and needful action.

Evaluation Report of the Deer Park-Kesoram Cement, Basant Nagar, Peddapalli District, Telangana, was placed before the Technical Committee in its 117th Meeting held on January 16, 2026. The Technical Committee, after detailed deliberation, made its recommendation to the Central Zoo Authority. Subsequently, the Central Zoo Authority in its 43rd Meeting held on February 3rd, 2026 approved the recommendation of the Technical Committee.

As per provisions of sub-section (1), (3) and (4) of Section 38-H under the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, the period after January 20, 2018 is regularized and renewed the recognition of Deer Park-Kesoram Cement, Basant Nagar, Peddapalli District, Telangana as a Mini Zoo for a period up to **February 3, 2029** subject to compliance with following conditions as per the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 (RZR) and mid-term evaluation of the zoo.

2	10.5(1)	Non maintenance of Records in the CZA formats and untrained officers is the main problem of the Zoo. There are 3 animal keepers in the Zoo. The officer in charge has a BSc background but he has not learned any wildlife management skills nor he made any attempts to acquire the knowledge. He needs to be taught in the nehru zoological park so that the zoo can be managed in a better way and scientifically.. The Plant Head has agreed to appoint a veterinarian on full time basis and train him in a reputed zoo for proper management of wild animals. The veterinarian needs to be trained for animal restraint techniques, health of animals monitoring and diet chart preparation for animals etc so that the health of wild animals can be maintained in a better way. Since there is only one enclosure of spotted deer all the functions of curator and officer in charge and veterinarian duties can be maintained by a single veterinarian. This situation being a peculiar one it may be considered	8 months
3	9.1	At present only 2 or 3 fawns are seen every year indicating the breeding is not taking place satisfactorily. Hence at least 50% of the population be exchanged with other zoos to infuse new blood in the enclosure. or they may be translocated to a	8 months

4	5.2 (3)	At present food grains are stored in gunny bags. They need to store them in air tight containers and diet charts be prepared for each animal. Though the cement plant has a grassy area the grasses are not cut and offered to the animals saying that they are not accepting the grasses. In this regard, grasses be added to the diet regularly and the foliage content be reduced gradually and fruit and vegetables be avoided gradually. At present subabul is offered in plenty but grasses content needs to be increased and a habit of eating grasses be cultivated amongst spotted deer.	1 month
5	5.2 (5)	At present food is offered at 2 places. Since there are 3 herds at least at 3 places food be offered to animals so that clashes can be avoided. Salt licks be provided near watering points.	1 month

8	2.2	For the last 35 years the kesoram cement has been maintaining the deer population. They do have an affinity to wildlife but the problem is that they are not maintained scientifically. The area is a tree clad natural forest . The environment is good and plenty of water is available. in the last 3 years they have constructed a compound wall all along the boundary, separating the colony and roads and visibility from outside is prevented. A lot of efforts have been made. The Plant head is committing the budget for the next 3 years in the next meeting indicating their willingness to provide funds as well as recruiting the veterinarian. Looking into these developments the management is given a fresh chance to recruit a veterinarian and manage the deer population. After making necessary habitat developments by planting short bamboo varieties and creating wallows, the management can gradually shift to sambhar population or they can have 2 enclosures. The zoo is suggested to plant bamboo all along the compound wall inside which will act as a barrier and will provide fodder to sambhars. Since water is plentifully available, wallows can be maintained artificially. so a fresh opportunity may be given with adequate training to the staff for better	

		management.	
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A half-yearly compliance report to the Central Zoo Authority on implementation of the aforesaid conditions shall be submitted by the zoo.

The Deer Park-Kesoram Cement, Basant Nagar, Peddapalli District, Telangana shall comply with such standards and norms as are or may be specified or imposed, by or under the provisions of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 or the rules made thereunder, and the zoo operator shall comply with the directions and guidelines issued by the Central Zoo Authority from time to time, for the purpose of maintenance and upkeep of the zoo.

The renewal of recognition of the Deer Park-Kesoram Cement, Basant Nagar, Peddapalli District, Telangana, for period beyond **February 3, 2029** would be considered on the basis of compliance of the conditions stated above and general performance of the zoo.

The recognition of the Deer Park-Kesoram Cement, Basant Nagar, Peddapalli District, Telangana, shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority at any point of time if the Zoo Operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.

**ORDER**

Whereas, the appeal dated January 19, 2022 was filed by Shri K. Bharath Kumar, Officer in-charge, Deer Park-Kesoram Cement, Basanthnagar, Peddapalli District, Telangana, against the Order No.19-124/93-CZA(4)(NE) dated January 5, 2022, issued by the Central Zoo Authority cancelling recognition of the Deer Park-Kesoram Cement, as per provisions laid under Section 38-H(6) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, for non-compliance of provisions laid under the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 and Guidelines there under.

2. And whereas, a hearing was held by the undersigned as the Appellate Authority in the capacity of the Secretary to the Government of India (Environment, Forest and Climate Change), as per the provisions laid under Section 38-H(7) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, on April 25, 2022 in Kaveri Conference Room, 4<sup>th</sup> Floor, Prithvi Wing, Indira Paryavaran Bhawan, Jor Bagh Road, New Delhi. During the hearing, following were present:

**Appellant:** Deer Park-Kesoram Cement, Basanthnagar, Peddapalli District, Telangana, through Shri Rajesh Garg, Shri N. Sreenath Kumar and Shri K. Bharath Kumar, Officer in-charge

**Respondent:** The Central Zoo Authority, New Delhi through Dr. Sanjay Kumar Shukla, Member Secretary, Central Zoo Authority.

3. And whereas, during hearing of the appeal, Respondent has submitted following as prominent grounds for cancellation of recognition of the Deer Park-Kesoram Cement, Basanthnagar:

(a) Recognition of the appellant zoo was cancelled earlier on November 29, 2018 for non-compliance with the norms prescribed under the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009. Even after providing another opportunity by the Appellate Authority, the appellant did not comply with the prescribed norms.

(b) There has been no introduction of new blood in captive animal population in the zoo. This is required to sustain population of physically, genetically and behaviorally healthy animals.

- (c) The visitors' path and thorough fare road to township are one and the same. Hence there is no regulation of visitors' movement .
- (d) Height of perimeter is less than prescribed height intermittently. Also, it is in deviation from the norms specified as combination of wall, chain-link fence and tin sheets is provided. Thus, effectiveness of perimeter is compromised. For a zoo surrounded by human landscape, perimeter wall of 2 metres height is prescribed.
- (e) The Officer in-charge is holding responsibilities other than the zoo, in a Dairy Farm run by the Zoo Operator. This arrangement does not meet requirement of "whole time in-charge" specified in the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009(RZR).
- (f) the appellat zoo does not have any provision of budget. Also, compliance of observation on proposed Master plan communicated on 25th March, 2021 is awaited from the zoo
- (g) There is no exclusive greenbelt and natural vegetation in the zoo as specified in the RZR, 2009 as perimeter of the zoo and barrier of animal enclosure are one and the same.
- (h) Quarantine and Isolation area are not designated in the zoo.
- (i) Rational approach is not adopted regarding quantum of diet offered to animals .Same quantity is being offered irrespective of drastic change in number of animals.
- (j) Waste management in the zoo premises is not proper.
- (k) Foot bath with disinfectant is not provided at entry / exit points of animal house.
- (l) Vaccination and de-worming schedule of captive animals as well as disinfection of animal enclosure schedule is not maintained.
- (m) Animal restraining equipment is not procured.
- (n) Mandatory annual screening of zoo personnel against zoonotic diseases is grossly incomplete.
- (o) The prescribed records of animals as prescribed by the Central Zoo Authority namely Animal History Card, Keeper's Diary, Daily Report and Treatment Card are not being maintained.
- (p) It is observed that there is no designated carcass disposal area. Waste Management Rules notified by the Central Government in the year 2016 are not complied.

(q) Number of the Spotted deer housed in the Deer Park is beyond carrying capacity. The Zoo Operator did not adopt population control measures. 71 Spotted Deer are housed in an area that can accommodate 39 individuals.

(r) Transferred and released 22 Spotted Deer (13 male : 9 female) on January 8, 2019, in their natural habitat. However, it is not in compliance with the protocol. Prior health screening was not done. Also, requisite permission is not produced for transfer of all the 22 Spotted Deer.

(s) Deer Park is not accessible to general public. It is operating as a private collection. Moreover, there is no provision for entry ticket and thus, number of visitors is not getting recorded.

4. And whereas, during hearing of the appeal, the representatives of the appellant have submitted following:

(a) the appellant has constructed non-porous RCC compound wall on road side of the zoo and work is in progress along the perimeter.

(b) the Zoo Operator of appellant zoo has appointed exclusive whole-time officer in-charge and also appointed full-time expert Veterinarian and Zoologist.

(c) the appellant zoo introduced new blood in its animal collection by way of acquiring two Spotted Deer from the Karimnagar Deer Park, Telangana.

(d) That the appellant has prepared revised layout of the zoo and produced the same during hearing.

(e) That the appellant be allowed one opportunity to rectify the lapses pointed out by the Respondent.

(f) That area of the appellant zoo is presently 5.30 Hectare and a proposal is under progress for enhancement in area of the appellant zoo to 12.00Hectare.

(g) That the appellant is committed to open zoo to common public and assured maintenance of record on visitors' number. That the appellant has taken corrective action on material flaws or deficiency specified in the impugned order and hence Respondent's order be set aside.

5. Now, therefore, after going through the pleadings of both the parties and after careful consideration of the records placed before me, I hereby set aside the Respondent's Order No19-124/93-CZA(4)(NE) dated January 5, 2022 and dispose the appeal with following directives:

(a) The appellant shall submit detailed report on action taken against each of the grounds cited in the impugned order for consideration of the Respondent with specific reference to correction of Record Keeping as per norms.

(b) The Respondent shall reconsider the appellant's application for renewal of recognition under Section 38-H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972.

**ORDER**  
**[UNDER SUB-SECTION (6) OF SECTION 38-H**  
**OF THE WILD LIFE (PROTECTION) ACT, 1972]**

Whereas, the Central Zoo Authority in its 32<sup>nd</sup> Meeting held on November 19, 2018, cancelled recognition of the Deer Park-Kesoram Cement, Basanthnagar, Peddapalli District, Telangana, vide Order dated November 29, 2018. However, the Appellate Authority, on hearing the appeal filed by the zoo, set aside the CZA's Order. While setting aside the CZA's Order dated November 29, 2018, and disposal of the appeal filed by the zoo, issued following directives vide Order dated July 18, 2019:

- (a) The Central Zoo Authority shall reconsider the application filed by the Deer Park-Kesoram Cement for renewal of recognition for period beyond January 20, 2018, as per provisions of Section 38-H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972.*
- (b) The Central Zoo Authority shall verify within one month, progress made by the Zoo Operator against each of the grounds cited for cancellation of recognition in the Order dated November 29, 2018.*
- (c) The Master Plan submitted by the Zoo after cancellation of recognition shall be considered by the Central Zoo Authority for further course of action.*

2. And whereas, application under Sub-section (2) of Section 38-H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, for renewal of recognition of the Deer Park-Kesoram Cement, Basanthnagar, for period beyond January 20, 2018, was filed by Shri N. Sreenath Kumar, DGM (Civil), Kesoram Industries Limited, on January 15, 2021.

3. And whereas, compliance reported by the Deer Park-Kesoram Cement, Basanthnagar, was placed before the Technical Committee in its 101<sup>st</sup> Meeting wherein, after due deliberation, recommended to the CZA to take up action as per provisions laid down under the Sub-section (6) of Section 38-H in the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 and serve a notice upon the respective Zoo Operator to show cause why recognition of the zoo should not be suspended or cancelled, with an opportunity of hearing before the Member Secretary of the Central Zoo Authority.

4. And whereas, evaluation of the Deer Park-Kesoram Cement, Basanthnagar, was carried out on August 15, 2021, by Shri T Ajay Kumar, Evaluation and Monitoring Assistant, from this office.

5. And whereas, detailed evaluation report was circulated to the Chief Wildlife Warden of the State and the Zoo Operator of the Deer Park-Kesoram Cement, Basanthnagar, respectively on September 13, 2021, for reply within three working days. However, reply was not received.

6. And whereas, evaluation report of the Deer Park-Kesoram Cement, Basanthnagar, was placed before the Central Zoo Authority in its 38<sup>th</sup> Meeting held on November 16, 2021. The Central Zoo Authority, after detailed deliberation, decided to serve notice to the Deer Park-Kesoram Cement, Basanthnagar, under sub-section (6) of Section 38-H under the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972. Accordingly, notice dated November 30, 2021, was served upon the Zoo Operator. In the said notice dated November 30, 2021, the Zoo Operator of the Deer Park-Kesoram Cement, Basanthnagar, was directed to show cause as to why recognition of the Deer Park-Kesoram Cement, Basanthnagar, under Section 38-H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, should not be suspended or cancelled and asked to close down. Also, period of seven days was granted to the Zoo Operator, to file reply to the said notice. Further, the Zoo Operator of the Deer Park-Kesoram Cement, Basanthnagar / authorised representative, was provided an opportunity of hearing before the Member Secretary, Central Zoo Authority on December 7, 2021 at 02:00 PM. The Zoo Operator was advised to specify whether the said hearing is desired in person or virtual mode through Cisco-webex platform.

7. And whereas, Shri K. Bharat Kumar, Officer in-charge, Deer Park-Kesoram Cement, has submitted his reply to this Office on December 6, 2021. Further, the reply does not have any written authorization from the Zoo Operator addressed to this Office. This Office vide notice dated December 7, 2021, informed the Zoo Operator that the said reply is not in consistence with provisions of Sub-section 6 of Section 38-H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 read with Sub-rule (m) of Rule 2 under the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009.

8. And whereas, in reply dated December 7, 2021, Shri P. Radhakrishnan, Whole Time Director & CEO, Kesoram Industries Limited, has preferred virtual hearing and has authorised Shri K. Bharath Kumar, Officer in-charge, Shri N. Sreenath Kumar, DGM (Civil), Coordinator and Shri S. Govinda Rao, AVP (HR/IR), Coordinator respectively, as his representatives to attend hearing and also authorised Officer in-charge, Deer Park-Kesoram Cement, to file reply to notice. Accordingly, written submission dated December 7, 2021, from Shri K. Bharat Kumar, Officer in-charge, Deer Park-Kesoram Cement, is considered. In the said written submission from the zoo, column (5) of the reply titled "Time period to comply" is wrongly inserted by the Officer in-charge that was not in the notice served to the Zoo Operator. When pointed out, in response, assured that another e-mail would be sent to report to compliance. Further assured compliance report once in 15 days. In the hearing conducted by the Member Secretary, CZA, on December 7, 2021, from 02:00 PM to 02:44 PM, in addition to authorised representatives mentioned above, Shri Manoj Patra, AVP, Kesoram Industries Limited, though not authorized by the Zoo Operator to represent him in the hearing, and also pointed out by the Officer representing the CZA Secretariat during the hearing, he continued to attend the hearing and made major portion of the submission during the hearing. Details of violation of the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 committed by the Deer Park-Kesoram Cement, Basanthnagar, submission made by the zoo and remarks of the Secretariat of the CZA are as follows:

9. And whereas, during the hearing, the Member Secretary, CZA, has asked representatives of the Zoo Operator to explain the interest to operate the zoo as no interest is reflected in the operations of the zoo and animals are suffering. In response, representatives of the Zoo Operator have informed that the zoo is being operated as part of their Corporate Policy and for greenery. The Member Secretary, CZA has observed that the CZA's experience with the Zoo Operator, in terms of housing, upkeep and healthcare of captive animals, is not good over the years and the Deer Park-Kesoram Cement, Basanthnagar is not operating as per conditions stipulated by the Central Zoo Authority and recommended cancellation of its recognition at this juncture.

10. And whereas, proceedings of the said hearing under Sub-section (6) of Section 38-H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, were circulated to members of the Central Zoo Authority. In view of the failure of the Zoo Operator of the Deer Park-Kesoram Cement, Basanthnagar, to comply with conditions stipulated by the Central Zoo Authority that are specified above, the members of the Central Zoo Authority, in exercise of powers conferred under Sub-section (6) of Section 38-H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, concurred to action proposed by this Secretariat and decided to cancel recognition of the Deer Park-Kesoram Cement, Basanthnagar.

11. Now, therefore, having been given sufficient opportunity, the recognition of the Deer Park-Kesoram Cement, Basanthnagar, Peddapalli District, Telangana, is hereby cancelled as per provisions of Sub-section (6) of Section 38-H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, with a provision to prefer an appeal before the Central Government, under Sub-section (7) and (8) of Section 38-H of the Act, within thirty days of issuance of this Order.

12. Appropriate transfer and rehabilitation of animals housed in the Deer Park-Kesoram Cement, Basanthnagar, following the prescribed protocol should be ensured by the Zoo Operator in consultation with the Chief Wildlife Warden of the State and the zoo should be physically closed to visitors under intimation to this Office.

**ORDER**

Whereas, the appeal dated 18<sup>th</sup> December, 2018 filed by the Deer Park, Kesoram Cement against Order No.19-124/93-CZA(4)(Vol.I&II)(NS)/4891/2018 dated 29<sup>th</sup> November, 2018 issued by the Central Zoo Authority cancelling recognition of the Deer Park, Kesoram Cement, Basant Nagar, Peddapalli District, Telangana, as per provisions laid under Section 38-H(6) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, for non-compliance of standard and norms laid under the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 and Guidelines there under.

And whereas, a hearing was held by the undersigned as Appellate Authority in the capacity of the Secretary to the Government of India (Environment, Forests and Climate Change) as per provisions laid under Section 38-H(7) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, on 11<sup>th</sup> March, 2019 at Conference Hall in the Office of the undersigned in Indira Paryavaran Bhawan, Aliganj, New Delhi. During the hearing, following were present:

**Petitioner: Deer Park, Kesoram Cement**

Representative/s of the Deer Park, Kesoram Cement.

**Respondent: Central Zoo Authority**

Dr. Anup Kumar Nayak, Member Secretary, Dr. Brij Kishor Gupta, Evaluation and Monitoring Officer and Mr. T. Ajay Kumar, Evaluation and Monitoring Assistant represented the Central Zoo Authority.

Also, Dr. Gopinath, Joint Director (Wildlife), MoEF&CC and Shri Sashi Kumar from Wildlife Division, MoEF&CC assisted the undersigned in recording the proceedings of hearing.

And whereas, during hearing of the appeal, Dr. Anup Kumar Nayak, Member Secretary, Central Zoo Authority appraised following as prominent grounds for cancellation of recognition of the Deer Park, Kesoram Cement:

1. Failed to manage the Zoo scientifically. Did not infuse new blood in the population of captive Spotted deer housed in the Zoo since 1995.
2. Failed to regulate circulation of visitors in the Zoo.
3. Compromised with safety of captive animals by leaving the damaged perimeter wall unattended.
4. Failed to appoint whole time in-charge of the Zoo and scientific staff to assist him.
5. Did not obtain approval of the CZA of Master Plan for long term development of the Zoo.
6. Housed captive animals beyond its carrying capacity.

7. Housing, upkeep and healthcare of captive animals is not as per standards and norms prescribed by the CZA.
8. Mandated records are not being maintained.

And whereas, the Deer Park, Kesoram Cement pleaded following in the appeal dated 18<sup>th</sup> December, 2018:

1. GI sheet fixed to the chain-link fence.
2. Damaged perimeter wall is repaired.
3. Hired Consultant, availing services of Veterinarian, recruited Zoologist and Curator.
4. Revised Master Plan submitted to the CZA on 13.12.2018.
5. From the surplus stock of captive animals, trans-located 12 Spotted deer to their natural habitat.
6. Kraal is provided, installed stand-off barrier, prepared Diet-Schedule/ Vaccination Schedule for captive animals. Also constructed Treatment Room.
7. Maintaining the records in form prescribed by the Central Zoo Authority.

And whereas, in addition to the appeal filed, the representatives of the Deer Park, Kesoram Cement pleaded during the hearing that action is taken by the Zoo Operator on the grounds cited for cancellation of recognition. Also, stated that the facility being operated by the Kesoram Industries Limited is a Deer Park not a Zoo as stated in the Order dated 29<sup>th</sup> November, 2018 issued by the Central Zoo Authority. Further, stated that Dr. Naveen Kumar retired from the Nehru Zoological Park, Hyderabad is hired as Consultant of the Deer Park, Kesoram Cement.

Now, therefore, after going through the pleadings of the parties, I set aside the Central Zoo Authority's Order dated 29<sup>th</sup> November, 2018 and dispose the appeal filed by the Zoo with following directives:

- a. The Central Zoo Authority shall reconsider the application filed by the Deer Park, Kesoram Cement for renewal of recognition for period beyond 20<sup>th</sup> January, 2018, as per provisions of Section 38-H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972.
- b. The Central Zoo Authority shall verify within one month, progress made by the Zoo Operator against each of the grounds cited for cancellation of recognition in the Order dated 29<sup>th</sup> November, 2018.
- c. The Master Plan submitted by the Zoo after cancellation of recognition shall be considered by the Central Zoo Authority for further course of action.



Grant of recognition to Deer Park, Kesoram Cement at Basanthnagar' beyond 31.04.2010 would be considered on the basis of compliance of the conditions stated above and general performance of the zoo.

The recognition to the Deer Park, Kesoram Cement at Basanthnagar shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority, at any point of time if the Zoo Operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.
