Sir/Madam,

With reference to above, it is to inform that the recognition of People for Animals Rescue Centre, Bengaluru, Karnataka was accorded up to December 11, 2024 vide reference no. 3 above. The application for the renewal of recognition of People for Animals Rescue Centre, Bengaluru, Karnataka for the period beyond December 11, 2024 was received by this office vide reference no. 2 above.

Shri KSSVP Reddy, IFS (retired), Former Principal Chief Conservator of Forests – Tamil Nadu was deputed by this office to carry out the evaluation of the People for Animals Rescue Centre, Bengaluru, Karnataka vide CZA letter at reference no. 1 above. The Zoo was accordingly evaluated from September 6 to 8, 2025 by Shri KSSVP Reddy, IFS (retired), Former Principal Chief Conservator of Forests – Tamil Nadu.

The evaluation report (copy enclosed) as submitted by the evaluation officer was deliberated in the 117th meeting of the Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority held on January 16, 2026. The Technical Committee after detailed deliberations recommended to the Central Zoo Authority for the renewal of recognition of People for Animals Rescue Centre, Bengaluru, Karnataka for a period of three years and to

regularise the period after December 11, 2024, subject to compliance with observation/recommendation in the table below and mid-term evaluation. Further, the Committee recommended that the Zoo Operator may be directed to submit compliance report within three months of renewal followed by half-yearly report.

Subsequently, the recommendation of 117th Technical Committee Meeting was placed in the 43rd meeting of the Central Zoo Authority held on February 03, 2026 wherein in exercise of powers conferred under sub-section (1), (3) and (4) of Section 38-H under the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, approved recommendation of the Technical Committee.

Accordingly, the Central Zoo Authority has regularised the period after December 11, 2024 and renewed the recognition of People for Animals Rescue Centre, Bengaluru, Karnataka for a period up to February 02, 2029 under Section 38-H(1), (3) & (4) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972.

The recognition of People for Animals Rescue Centre, Bengaluru, Karnataka shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority, at any point of time, if the zoo operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.

With reference to above, I am directed to inform that the recognition of People for Animals Rescue Centre, Bengaluru, Karnataka was accorded up to August 19th, 2021 vide reference no. 3 above. The application for the renewal of recognition of People for Animals Rescue Centre, Bengaluru, Karnataka for the period beyond August 19th, 2021 was received by this office vide reference no. 2 above.

Shri Anil Johri, IFS(Retd.), Former PCCF, Gujarat was deputed by this office to carry out the evaluation of the People for Animals Rescue Centre, Bengaluru, Karnataka vide CZA letter at reference no. 1 above. The Zoo was accordingly evaluated on May 04th, 2022.

The evaluation report (copy enclosed) as submitted by the evaluation officer was deliberated in the 106th meeting of the Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority held on September 27th, 2022. The Technical Committee after detailed deliberations recommended to the Central Zoo Authority for the renewal of recognition of People for Animals Rescue Centre, Bengaluru, Karnataka for a period of two years and to regularise the period after August 19th, 2021, subject to compliance with observation/ recommendation in the table below and mid-term evaluation. The members also recommended that the Zoo Operator may be directed to submit half-yearly compliance report with respect to observation/ recommendation stipulated while renewal of recognition.

Subsequently, the recommendation of 106th Technical Committee Meeting was approved by the Chairperson, Central Zoo Authority. Accordingly, the Central Zoo Authority has regularised the period after August 19th, 2021 and renewed the recognition of People for Animals Rescue Centre, Bengaluru, Karnataka for a period up to December 11th, 2024 under Section 38-H(1), (3) & (4) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972. This is subject to the ratification of this decision in the next meeting of the Central Zoo Authority.

Sir,

With reference to above, the undersigned is directed to inform that recognition of the People for Animals, Bengaluru under Section 38-H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, was valid till January 23, 2018. Application dated February 13, 2018 received in this office from the General Manager and Chief Veterinarian, PFA, Bengaluru for renewal of recognition. Shri B.S. Bonal, IFS (Retired) and Shri Lakshminarasimha, Scientific Officer in Office of the CZA, evaluating officers deputed by this office has evaluated the zoo on March 4, 2020. Copy of the Evaluation Report is enclosed herewith for your perusal and needful action.

2. Evaluation Report of the People for Animals, Bengaluru was placed before the Technical Committee in its 96th Meeting held on July 30, 2020. The Technical Committee, after detailed deliberation, made its recommendation to the Central Zoo Authority.

3. This office issued Office Memorandum F.No.7-10/2020-CZA(PART-I) dated August 25, 2020 regarding renewal of recognition of the zoo. Subsequently, the Central Zoo Authority, in its 37th Meeting held on December 7, 2020, in exercise of powers conferred under sub-section (1), (3) and (4) of Section 38-H under the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, approved recommendation of the Technical Committee.

4. The Central Zoo Authority has regularised the period after January 23, 2018 and renewed recognition of the People for Animals, Bengaluru as a Rescue Centre for a period up to **August 19, 2021** subject to compliance with following conditions as per the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 (RZR) and mid-term evaluation of the zoo.



7. The recognition of the People for Animals, Bengaluru shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority at any point of time if the Zoo Operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.

Sir,

Reference is invited to above cited correspondence. It is to inform that the evaluation of the People for Animals Rescue Centre, Bengaluru was carried out by Dr. Brij Kishor Gupta, Evaluation and Monitoring Officer, CZA on 2nd January, 2017. The evaluation report of the People for Animals Rescue Centre, Bengaluru, as submitted by the evaluating officer was considered by the Technical Committee in its 81st Meeting held on 24th January, 2017.

The Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority has decided to issue Show Cause Notice under Section 38H (5&6) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 to the management of People for Animals Rescue Centre, Bengaluru, for non-compliance with conditions stipulated by the Central Zoo Authority in violation of Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009, to provide time period of six months to the zoo to submit a compliance report on the issues mentioned in the Show Cause Notice. Besides, the Committee has decided to grant conditional renewal of recognition for a period of one year. Show Cause Notice is being sent separately. The renewal of recognition of the People for Animals Rescue Centre, Bengaluru as a "Rescue Centre" under provisions of Section 38H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 is for a period up to 23rd January, 2018 subject to the compliance of the following directives under the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 and mid-term evaluation of the Rescue Centre:-
