Sir/Madam,

With reference to above, I am directed to inform that the recognition of People for Animal Rescue Centre, Wardha, Maharashtra was accorded up to August 19th, 2021 vide reference no. 3 above. The application for the renewal of recognition of People for Animal Rescue Centre, Wardha, Maharashtra for the period beyond August 19th, 2021 was received by this office vide reference no. 2 above.

Dr. Rajeev Mishra, IFS (Retd.) was deputed by this office to carry out the evaluation of People for Animal Rescue Centre, Wardha, Maharashtra vide CZA letter at reference no. 1 above. The Zoo was accordingly evaluated on June 20th, 2022.

The evaluation report (copy enclosed) as submitted by the evaluation officer was deliberated in the 106th meeting of the Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority held on September 27th, 2022. The Technical Committee after detailed deliberations recommended to the Central Zoo Authority for the renewal of recognition of People for Animal Rescue Centre, Wardha, Maharashtra for a period of two years and to regularise the period after August 19th, 2021, subject to compliance with observation/ recommendation in the table below and mid-term evaluation. The

members also recommended that the Zoo Operator may be directed to submit half-yearly compliance report with respect to observation/ recommendation stipulated while renewal of recognition.

Subsequently, the recommendation of 106th Technical Committee Meeting was approved by the Chairperson, Central Zoo Authority. Accordingly, the Central Zoo Authority has regularised the period after August 19th, 2021 and renewed the recognition of People for Animal Rescue Centre, Wardha, Maharashtra for a period up to December 22, 2024 under Section 38-H (1), (3) & (4) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972. This is subject to the ratification of this decision in the next meeting of the Central Zoo Authority.

The recognition of People for Animal Rescue Centre, Wardha, Maharashtra for the period beyond December 22, 2024 would be considered on the basis of compliance of the conditions stated above, mid-term evaluation and general performance of the zoo.

The recognition of People for Animal Rescue Centre, Wardha, Maharashtra shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority, at any point of time, if the zoo operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.

Sir,

With reference to above, the undersigned is directed to inform that recognition of the People for Animal Rescue Centre, Wardha, under Section 38-H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, was valid till November 3, 2018. Application dated 19.10.2018 received in this office from the Secretary, People for Animals, Wardha, for renewal of recognition. Shri D.N.S. Suman, IFS (Retired), evaluating officer/s deputed by this office has evaluated the zoo on February 9, 2020. Copy of the Evaluation Report is enclosed herewith for your perusal and needful action.

2. Evaluation Report of the People for Animal Rescue Centre, Wardha was placed before the Technical Committee in its 96th Meeting held on July 30, 2020. The Technical Committee, after detailed deliberation, made its recommendation to the Central Zoo Authority.

3. This office issued Office Memorandum F.No.7-10/2020-CZA(PART-I) dated August 25, 2020 regarding renewal of recognition of the zoo. Subsequently, the Central Zoo Authority, in its 37th Meeting held on December 7, 2020, in exercise of powers conferred under sub-section (1), (3) and (4) of Section 38-H under the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, approved recommendation of the Technical Committee.

4. The Central Zoo Authority has regularised the period after November 3, 2018 and renewed recognition of the People for Animal Rescue Centre, Wardha as a Rescue Centre for a period up to **August 19, 2021** subject to compliance with following conditions as per the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 (RZR) and mid-term evaluation of the zoo.




