Sir/Madam,

With reference to above, I am directed to inform that the recognition of Kakatiya Zoological Park, Hanumakonda, Telangana was accorded up to August 19<sup>th</sup>, 2021 vide reference no. 3 above. The application for the renewal of recognition of Kakatiya Zoological Park, Hanumakonda, Telangana for the period beyond August 19<sup>th</sup>, 2021 was received by this office vide reference no. 2 above.

Shri Sisir Kumar Acharya, IFS (Retd.) was deputed by this office to carry out the evaluation of Kakatiya Zoological Park, Hanumakonda, Telangana vide CZA letter at reference no. 1 above. The Zoo was accordingly evaluated on June 15, 2022.

The evaluation report (copy enclosed) as submitted by the evaluation officer was deliberated in the 106<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority held on September 27<sup>th</sup>, 2022. The Technical Committee after detailed deliberations recommended to the Central Zoo Authority for the renewal of recognition of Kakatiya Zoological Park, Hanumakonda, Telangana for a period of two year and to regularise the period after August 19<sup>th</sup>, 2021, subject to compliance with observation/ recommendation in the table below and mid-term evaluation. The members also recommended that the Zoo

Operator may be directed to submit half-yearly compliance report with respect to observation/ recommendation stipulated while renewal of recognition.

Subsequently, the recommendation of 106<sup>th</sup> Technical Committee Meeting was approved by the Chairperson, Central Zoo Authority. Accordingly, the Central Zoo Authority has regularised the period after August 19<sup>th</sup>, 2021 and renewed the recognition of Kakatiya Zoological Park, Hanumakonda, Telangana for a period up to December 29, 2024 under Section 38-H(1), (3) & (4) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972. This is subject to the ratification of this decision in the next meeting of the Central Zoo Authority.

Further, half yearly report regarding progress made in the implementation of the aforesaid conditions should also be submitted to the Central Zoo Authority.

The recognition of Kakatiya Zoological Park, Hanumakonda, Telangana for the period beyond December 29, 2024 would be considered on the basis of compliance of the conditions stated above, mid-term evaluation and general performance of the zoo.

The recognition of Kakatiya Zoological Park, Hanumakonda, Telangana shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority, at any point of time, if the zoo operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.

This issues with the approval of the competent authority.

Reference is invited to above cited correspondence. It is to inform that the evaluation of the Kakatiya Zoological Park, Warangal, Telangana was carried out by Shri T. Ajay Kumar, EMA, CZA on 19.04.2017. The evaluation report of the Kakatiya Zoological Park, Warangal, Telangana was considered by the Technical Committee in its 85<sup>th</sup> Meeting held on 23.03.2018. After detailed deliberations, the Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority recommended to the CZA to consider grant of renewal of recognition to the Kakatiya Zoological Park, Warangal, Telangana for a period of one year. A copy of the evaluation report is enclosed with this letter for your kind perusal and needful action.

The recommendations of the 85<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Technical Committee held on 23.03.2018 were placed before the Central Zoo Authority in its 31<sup>st</sup> meeting held on 26.06.2018. The CZA approved the recommendation of the Technical Committee and decided to grant renewal of recognition to the Kakatiya Zoological Park, Warangal, Telangana under Section 38H(6) of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972.

The renewal of recognition to the Kakatiya Zoological Park, Warangal, Telangana as a "Small Category Zoo" as per the provisions of Section 38H(1) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 is for a period up to 22.03.2019 subject to the compliance of the following directives under the Recognition of Zoo Rules (RZR), 2009 and mid-term evaluation of the zoo and to regularise the period after 05.05.2017:-

Reference is invited to above cited correspondence. It is to inform that the evaluation of the Vana Vignan Kendra, Warangal was carried out by Dr. Devender Kumar on 26<sup>th</sup> February, 2016. The evaluation report of the Vana Vignan Kendra, Warangal as submitted by the evaluating officer was considered by the Technical Committee in its 78<sup>th</sup> Meeting held on 6<sup>th</sup> May, 2016.

The Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority has decided to issue Show Cause Notice under Section 38H (5&6) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 to the authorities of the Vana Vignan Kendra, Warangal for non-compliance with conditions stipulated by the Central Zoo Authority in violation of Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 (amended in 2013), to provide time period of six months to the zoo to submit a compliance report on the issues mentioned in the Show Cause Notice. Besides, the Committee has decided to grant conditional renewal for recognition for a period of one year. Show Cause Notice is being sent separately.

The renewal of recognition of Vana Vignan Kendra, Warangal as "a Small Category Zoo" as per the provisions of Section 38H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 is for a period up to 5<sup>th</sup> May, 2017 subject to the compliance of the following directives under Rule 10 of Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 (Amended in 2013) and mid-term evaluation of the zoo:-

Therefore, the Central Zoo Authority has decided to grant of renewal of recognition to the Van Vigyan Kendra, Warangal as "Small Category Zoo" under Section 38H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, for a period up to 31<sup>st</sup> January, 2016 subject to extend till 31<sup>st</sup> January, 2017 subject to the compliance of the following directives under the Recognition of Zoo (Amendment) Rules, 2013 on mid-term evaluation of the Zoo:-
